We are not alone: Mat.28:20

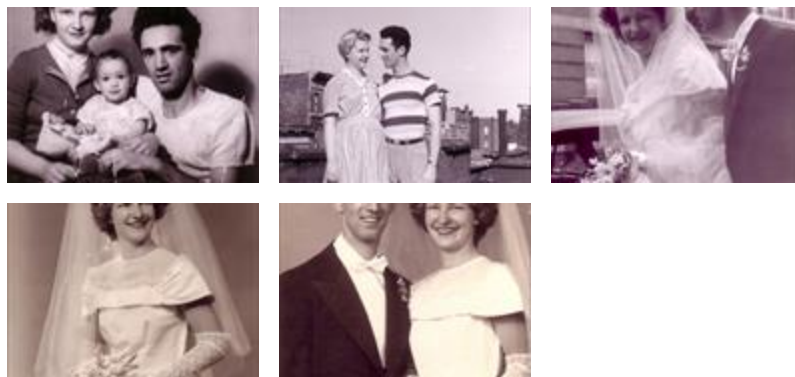
