Of course, learning of Al's stroke and health issues and seeing him decline over the years was difficult and it certainly took a great toll on Doris. Allan never met a stranger and smiled and laughed and talked all the time; Doris was very quiet. They both came to Charles' memorial gathering in 2008. Al was a steadfast friend. Wish I had remained a more steadfast friend to Doris. She was a dear sweet person; kind and gentle and will be greatly missed by all her family and friends and will be remembered for her devotion to her family, Your family has my sincerest sympathies and love and prayers during this sad and heavy time. 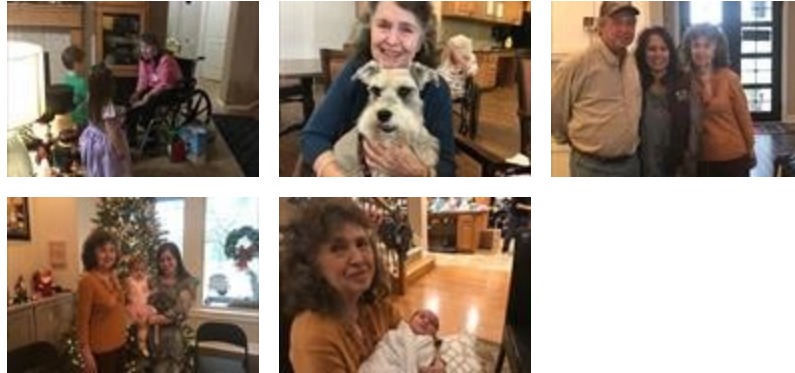

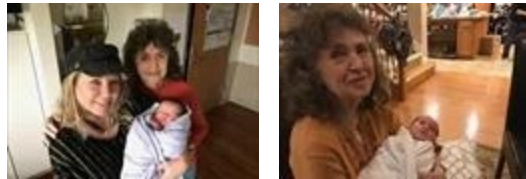
