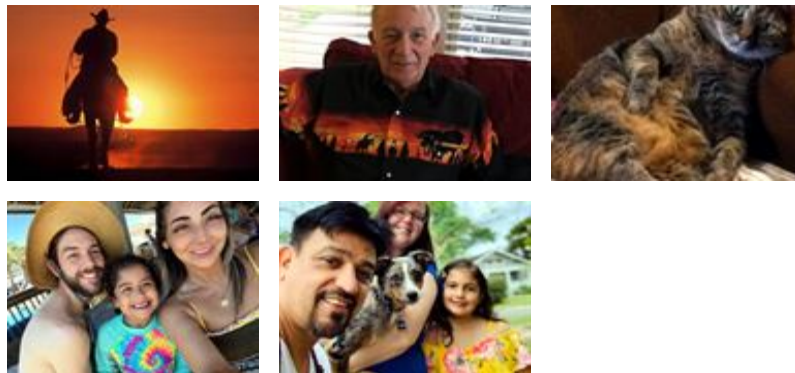
“ I first met Jack when I joined the Grand Prairie High School Rodeo Team in 1978 when I was a senior in school. He was our coach and sponsor for the Lone Star High School Rodeo Association. He gave many many hours and personal resources to our team, including his horses to compete with. He got no pay for all of that. After graduation I spent one year in the National Intercollegiate Rodeo Association, again with Jack’s help and use of his dogging horse. We became lifelong friends and I considered Jack as part of my family. After college I moved off to country life in SW Texas and a career in law enforcement. Although we hadn’t seen each other face to face for about 35 years, Jack and I stayed in touch. My Papa was about 20 years older than Jack, but cut of the same cloth. He too was very fond of Jack. Jack was probably the only man my Papa felt safe entrusting his son (me) too when it came to traveling around the state to rodeos as I competed in steer wrestling.
