Mildred Ann Fenner Moran passed peacefully from this life at the age of 87, on September 4, 2014 to join her Savior in Heaven. Mildred was born February 10, 1927 to Roy & Myrtle (Kelly) Fenner near Kosse, Tx. The family moved to Reagan, TX when Mildred was 9 years old and she graduated from Reagan High School in 1945, followed by Business College in Waco, TX. Mildred married the love of her life, Richard Woodward Moran on January 15, 1950 and raised five children, whom she loved and adored. She lost Richard to a stroke in 1976, but never stopped loving him. She thrived off of being able to do things for other people, especially if it included showing off her incredible cooking skills. She was known as a very strong woman, one who was considered a survivor, a “fighter,” who kept a smile on her face through many ups and downs of life. Even in her last days, she was known by caretakers as “smiling Mildred.” She was an active member of her church wherever she lived, and made many very dear friends throughout her life. She held several jobs through the years, seemingly finding her niche when she became a billing collector for Rubenstein’s and later for BankOne. She had such a sweet nature that customers actually wanted to pay their bills.
